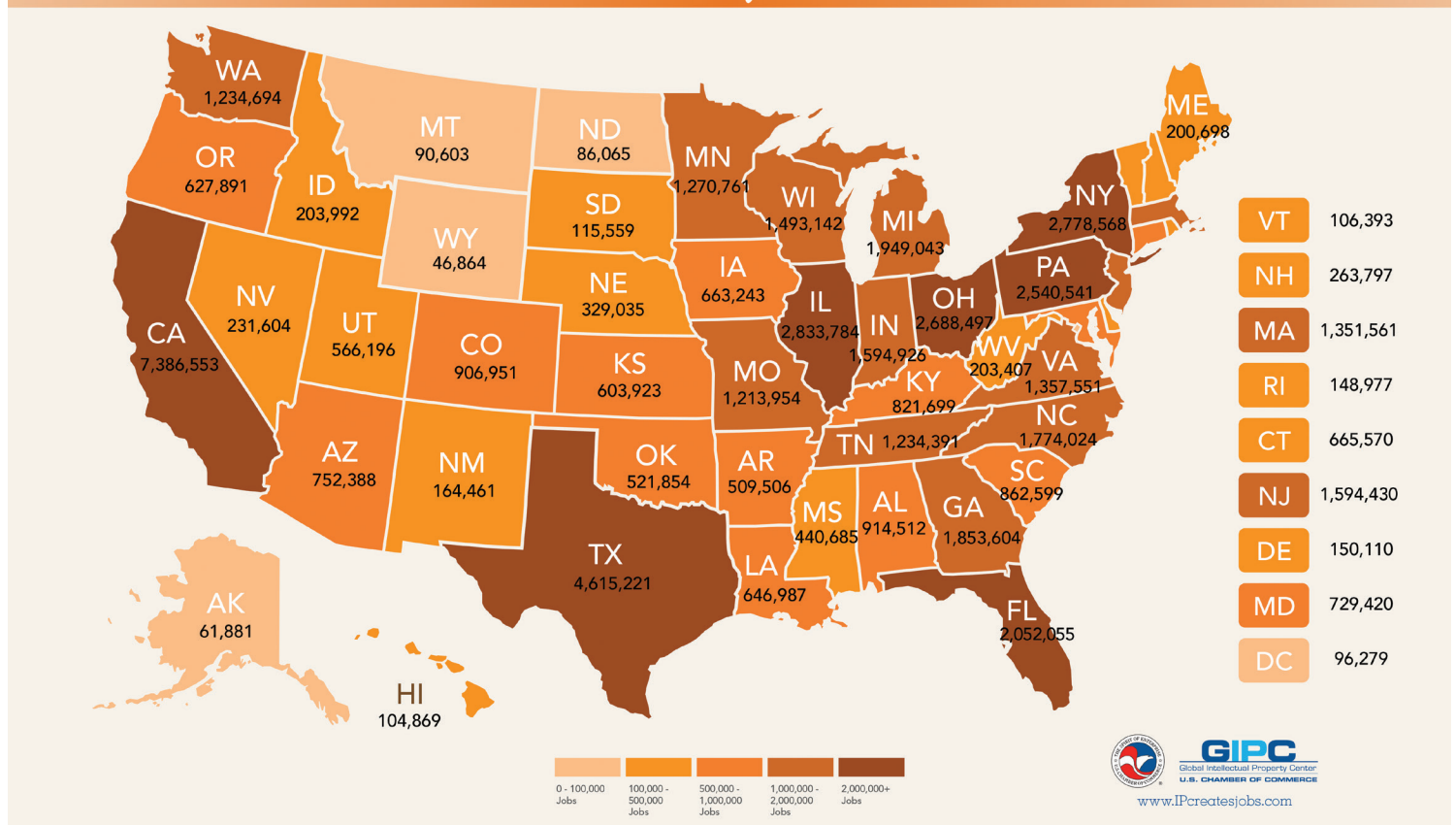


The Regional Impact of IP

- 40 million jobs are directly and indirectly attributable to IP-intensive industries in the US. ¹
- IP-intensive industries generate an annual output of \$5.8 trillion. ²
- IP-intensive industries account for 60% of US exports. ¹
- The average weekly salary of workers in IP-intensive industries is \$1,156--42% higher than workers in non-IP-intensive industries. ¹
